Whenever you are disheartened as you go about changing your destiny, think about how much women have fought for equality. Let's join hands to work towards a future that is BEYOND our imagination!

WOMEN EMPOWERMENT

Interview with Dr. Emmy Li



"The role in volunteering does not matter. Doing every task, regardless big or small, wholeheartedly matters more." This is the exact depiction of the years of volunteering involvements of Dr Li Yuen-mei, Emmy. Regardless of selling flags for fundraising or visiting needy elders in her secondary school days; organizing health exhibitions or serving the sick and poor in India during her university days; or providing voluntary treatment and training in Mainland China over the past decade, Dr Li has never bothered what role or position being assigned to her. She just puts in her best efforts to accomplish every task.

Dr Li works with the Hong Kong Eye Hospital. Since graduation in 2004, she has been volunteering with Project Vision, Lifeline Express and Orbis, and has served patients in deprived areas of many provinces in the Mainland. In 2009, she helped coordinate and run the Hainan project for cataract surgery and sight restoration. Within a year, she and her team have conducted some 30,000 surgeries and trained more than 10 Mainland doctors. Over the subsequent three years, she led her teammates to visit over 200 rural villages in Hainan and Chaonan. Besides providing eye check-ups for more than 10,000 villagers during the visits, they also collected data on eye problems of the people, which offered useful references for local authorities to plan on ophthalmic services.





Question 1

Interviewer:

Initially you were inspired to specialize in Pediatrics. However, you ended up being an Ophthalmologist. What did cause you to change your decision?

Dr Li:

While I was in my residency program at Queen Elizabeth Hospital, I always wanted to try out the pediatric ward. However, when I actually reached the pediatric ward, I realized that I became too attached and was very emotional with the children. These attachments had affected my professionalism and I decided that a Pediatrician was not suitable career for me. Instead, I made decision to be an Ophthalmologist. I like it because I could utilize my talent with medical surgeries as well as the opportunity to work with Orbis. Through this NGO I was able to take part in various philanthropic initiatives across the world.

Question 2

Interviewer:

During one of your electives in the medical school, you chose to go to India to do charity work. What were your most memorable experiences there? Did you face any difficulties? If you did, how did you tackle it?

Dr Li:

The idea of going to India for charity work started off with a 3 months extended holiday time between graduation and the residency program. Usually, the students chose to work with reputable medical institutions to have an early start for on-job training. However, we [Dr Li and some of her friends from medical school] were thinking that similar experiences would be available once the residency begins. In order to try out something different, we decided to engage with health department in India and had this charity check up in motion.

The local village in which the medical check up was conducted really did shock us. The villagers there were in very poor hygienic conditions. For example, flies were flying around their head, but they just didn't bother, which I found truly phenomenal. No drinkable water could be found within the vicinity. Some villagers experienced serious cases of anemia [when your blood lacks enough healthy red blood cells or hemoglobin]. This image had strongly engraved into my memory and made me realized how lucky we were living in Hong Kong where clean water, edible food and hygienic shelters are readily available.

This experience inspired me to take part in more charity work whenever the opportunity arises.

Question 3

Interviewer:

It was summer during your trip in India. Did the hot weather as well as the lack of air conditioning pose some difficulty for you?

Dr Li:

Actually not quite. There were two major difficulties worth noting however. First was the language and the second was the lack of medical equipment. At this moment, we needed to adapt

and improvise due to the lack of equipment. For example, we did not have suitable tools to use to stop bleeding, we had to improvise and rebuild the equipment with a pair of scalpels and some electric coils. On another occasion, the power went off in the middle the of the operation. Because of that, the microscope was no longer operational. We had to rely on a torch and some optic glasses to replace the use of microscopes. I was proud to be able to improvise my way out of these difficult situations, but at the same time realized that such technology conveniences were actually a luxury.

Question 4

Interviewer:

We know that you have been to Hainan Island to train local doctors to do anti-blind and cataract work. Due to that you were awarded the Outstanding Anti-blind Service Award of the Asia Pacific College of Ophthalmology. What kind of personality and what is the right attitude do you think an excellent volunteer should have?

Dr Li:

Actually, that project was designed specifically to allow Ophthalmologists to give back to society. It was one of the biggest initiatives conducted on Hainan Island at that time. That year, we conducted 300 operations and all of them were done by doctors whom we trained. The aim was to train doctors in Hainan to conduct such surgeries for patients who have cataract issues.

There are two things that an excellent volunteer shall possess. The first, it is maintaining curiosity to all that is happening around you. The second, it is willingness to adapt. As mentioned before, while doing charity work, there will be many circumstances where things will not go according to

the plan. Changes need to be made to yield the desired outcomes and accomplish the mission.

Question 5

Interviewer:

While you were in India, did you feel that being a women had hindered your work there?

Dr Li:

The main issue I had in India while being a women was personal safety. We always had a male to follow us. While walking on the streets, there were strange glares that were focused on me. To sum up, it is still required for women to be extra careful for the safety, especially abroad. In terms of career, I still think women need to spend extra effort to prove their professionalism, worth and talents. However, if you use your heart to communicate with each other, these barriers can be broken.



Question 6

Interviewer:

What do you think we can do today as a society to alleviate the obstacles mentioned and empowered more women?

Dr Li:

I think to share stories about professional women is already an empowerment. It is a proof that work-life balance is possible for women, who are have successful in career and have lovely family. Even though personal safety will remain as an issue for some time in developing countries, with homework done properly, we can still go out to do a charity work.

For society as a whole, I think we can apply Top-Down approach. There is a need for women to take time off from work occasionally for family matters. However, such family commitments can be compensated with flexible working hours. We can start by opening our mindset that work does not need to be "nine-to-six" or "all-or-nothing". With more and more organizations adopting flexible working hours, women can be empowered to take care of family or their pregnancy needs while being productive at their jobs.

Question 7

Interviewer:

You have a busy career and a family to take care. How can you make time for your philanthropic initiatives?

Dr Li:

Well, it is all about time management and priorities. For example, when my kids are in exam period, I will do less charity work. However, when I have more time, I will bring my family to volunteer with me. It also serves as a good example for my children and leads to stronger family bonding. My daughter is 4 years old and my son is 2 years old. Bringing them together helps to develop their empathy and emotional intelligence.

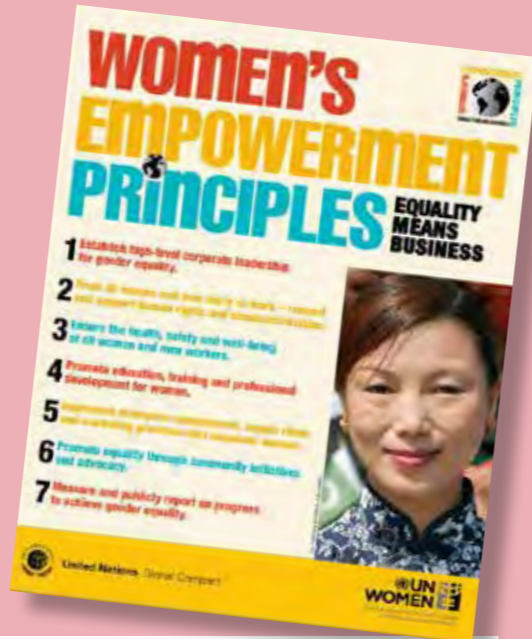
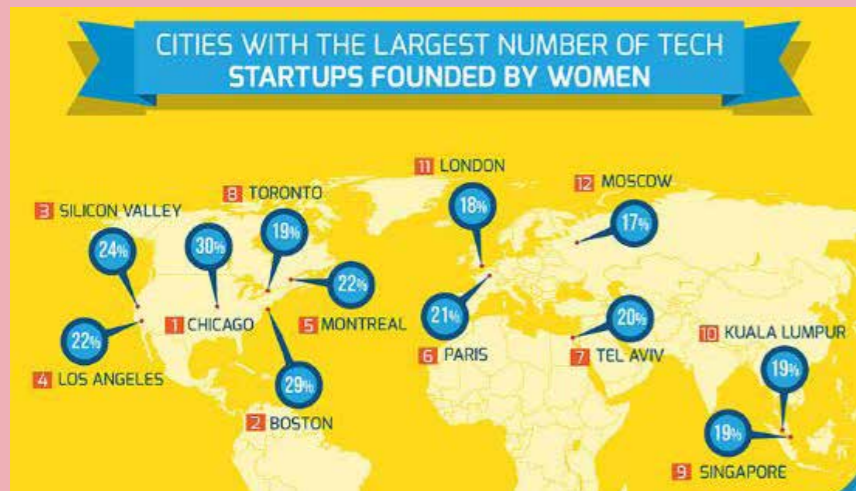
Interviewer:

Finally, your motto is "Comfort first, then relieve and only after that - treat". Why do you follow such principle?

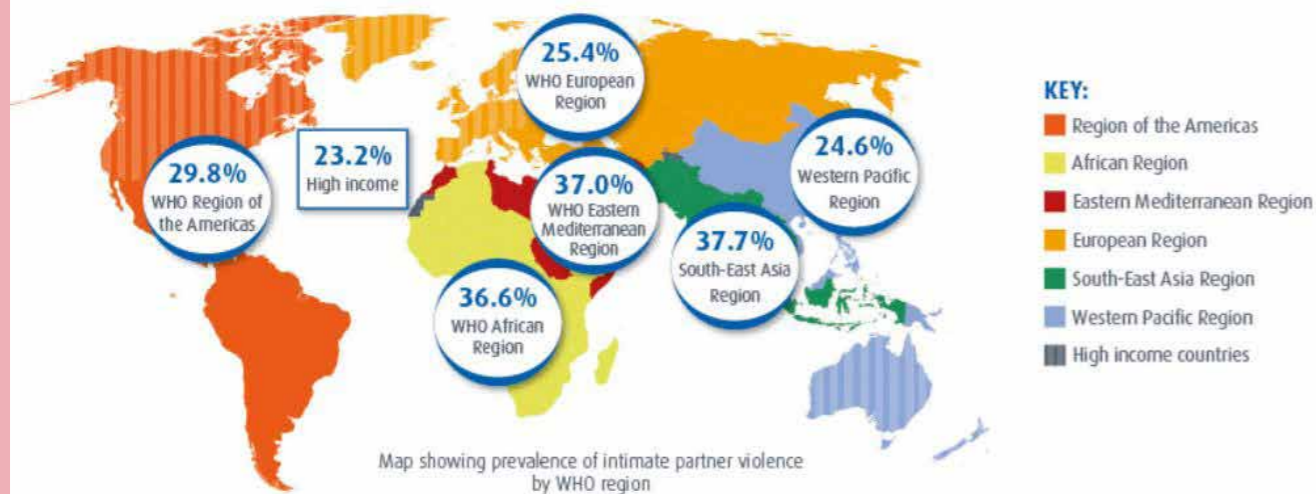
Dr Li:

Along the journey of my medical career, I met a lot of great teachers and mentors. They taught me that when you are diagnosing a patient, you need to look into the root cause of the patient's worries. For example, you have a patient who wants to improve their eyesight, before giving her a pair of glasses or Lasik surgery [surgical procedure that uses a laser to correct nearsightedness, farsightedness, and/or astigmatism], we first should understand her visual needs. If patient needs a very good and precise eyesight like myself, for example, Lasik would do them no good. They will really need an eyewear. Also everyone's eyes are built differently. Some people's eyes are drier or bigger or smaller. As you now see, being curious about your patient needs and have empathy to their situation will help here. I spend a lot of time communicating with patients and its through these experiences, I am able to reinforce on my motto / believes.

1 Can you give us some advice on personal and professional development points as a JCI member to get better achievements?

4 Can you give us some advise of how do we motivate ourselves to take action and achieve our dreams?

We need to motivate positively both ourselves and other people around us. You need to constantly add energy into your team's synergy like you add a fire. Be more focused on your difference from others and always be eager to learn for more development.

5 We believe that you have come a long way to become a JCI VP, what are the greatest challenges in your JCI life?

My every position and assigned duties were great challenges for me. Since I have taken the responsibility and spending my time and energy, I needed to put all my efforts to achieve planned results. I want to say 3 words: PASSION, HUNGRY and DISCIPLINE (PHD).

6 Have you ever thought of terminating this JCI career before? What made you stay?

Whenever I had issues and mistakes done, I saw opportunities in the challenges to overcome the issues. We are young people and we need lots of things to do. Therefore, we don't terminate but to cope with all issues and solve the issues.

7 What is that magic power that makes you standing in front and moving forward?

There are so many wonders in JCI we have to discover. Likewise, our life has many other wonders waiting for us. We can't stop the time, but we have to be a owner of a time. Instead of defeated by the problems, we have to conquer the problems.

8 What is JCI planning to do in the coming future? How would you expect the local chapter and their members to do for this big picture?

I will spend my remaining time in JCI as an active young member of the organization. I will put my effort to implement the JCI's new upcoming strategy for the coming years.

JCI 2018 ASPAC has successfully held at Kagoshima, Japan.

30TH 5-STAR TRAINING CAMP - THE CAMP WHERE NEW MEMBERS GROW



Thanks to hosting chapter of JCI Dragon, the 30th 5-Star Training Camp was held successfully on 5-6 May 2018. More than 60 participants from different LOMs including trainers' team led by Head Trainer Past President Senator Winnie Yeung joined the camp, which again adopted the refined 5 modules. Prospective members and those JCIHK members with less than 1 year of full members experience were invited to participate in this camp to learn more about JCI and how the value of JCI help them to blossom in their lives. More than 70 members attended the graduation ceremony, whilst positive feedback was received. Acting National President Senator Maric Cheng delivered a speech and congratulated the graduates.





Trial Run

To echo the world-wide civic movement "World Clean-Up Day", JCI Hong Kong created a brand new project "起動吧！全港沙灘潔淨日 2018." On 12 May 2018, a trial run beach clean-up was held for JCI Hong Kong members and core partners Scouts Hong Kong and Fire Service Department.

The trial run was held to educate all participants with first hand experience on beach clean-up. After removing waste from beach, participants were given a challenge to sort waste by categories: Plastic, Glass, Cigarettes Buds, Metal, Electronic Goods, and Food. During the sorting, participants realize the amount of waste left unattended and that plastic waste is the key problem in the shoreline of Hong Kong.

After the waste was sorted, JCI Hong Kong trainers educated participants on the actual pollution and waste being created daily by our community, the importance of waste sorting to increase resources being recycled, and how we can all help to reduce waste by reducing consumption.



Public Education Program

Public education is a key ingredient to the sustainability of World Cleanup Day's mission. JCI Hong Kong has recruited 18 JCI Hong Kong's members to become trainers to educate the public on World Cleanup Day and UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)

In March, 18 trainers were born after attending trainer's workshop. Trainers were equipped with practical facilitation skills, in-depth knowledge on waste reduction, 4 R's (Reduce, ReUse, Recycle, ReDesign), and how to apply UN SDGs to the community.

On April 14th Junior Chamber International Hong Kong (JCIHK) with support of The Hong Kong Polytechnic University (PolyU) organized Belt and Road International Youth Summit 2018. The event, held at Jockey Club Innovation Tower in PolyU Hung Hom campus, successfully gathered 400 youth from 17 countries to explore new cultural and economic opportunities.

EVENT HIGHLIGHTS



Mr Ronald Kan, JCI Hong Kong National President, in his speech, he warmly welcomed all the participants and guests of honor. He highlighted that most of the attendees joined the event for two main reasons: 1) to explore new opportunities and 2) to expand the network. For Chinese SMEs, which want to expand to other markets, and for Entrepreneurs from overseas who aim to launch business in China, Hong Kong is a great solution, because its strategic role as China's gateway to the world. JCI Hong Kong plays important role to connect and support China's "Belt and Road Initiative" (BRI).



Mrs Regina Ip, Co-Chair of Maritime Silk Road Society (MSRS), spoke at the opening of the "Belt and Road International Youth Summit 2018". During her speech, Mrs Ip highlighted the tremendous progress China had made since the launch of the Belt and Road Initiative by Chairman Xi Jinping in Kazakhstan in September 2013. Over US\$18.5 billion had been invested along the "Belt and Road" routes, and 180,000 jobs created for host countries. As regards the Hong Kong SAR Government's involvement, Mrs Ip pointed out that in December 2017, Chief Executive Mrs Carrie Lam signed an agreement on behalf of the government with National Development and Reform Commission Chairman Mr He Lifeng. The arrangement focuses on six key areas: "finance and investment", "infrastructure and maritime services", "economic and trade facilitation", "people-to-people bonds", "taking forward the Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macao Bay Area Development", and "enhancing collaboration in project interfacing and dispute resolution services".

an agreement on behalf of the government with National Development and Reform Commission Chairman Mr He Lifeng. The arrangement focuses on six key areas: "finance and investment", "infrastructure and maritime services", "economic and trade facilitation", "people-to-people bonds", "taking forward the Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macao Bay Area Development", and "enhancing collaboration in project interfacing and dispute resolution services".



Dr. Bernard Chan Pak-li, Secretary for Commerce and Economic Development HKSAR, gave presentation "Hong Kong as a springboard to enter China". Dr. Chen said that Hong Kong, as the world's freest, most competitive and market-economy system, is also a multi-dimensional international city. Hong Kong International Airport recorded over 72 million passengers per year, ranking it as the third in the world. After further development, it can accommodate 100 million passengers per year. He added that many infrastructure projects will be launched soon this year, including the Hong Kong-Zhuhai-Macao Bridge, the Hong Kong-Guangzhou-Hong Kong section of the Guangzhou-Shenzhen-Hong Kong High-speed Railway, and the Liantang Xiangyuanwei Port. This will greatly shorten the time of travel to and from the Mainland, which will in turn lead to job growth and opportunities.

PARTICIPANTS' OPINION ON BELT & ROAD

"As a JCI member I think it's really nice to be part of this initiative, because, as a member, it is really easy to connect with other countries JCI members in the region to do more business related to Belt & Road. For example, we initiated some student exchange program between Hong Kong and Indonesia - "people-to-people bonding". It's a good chance to learn about culture and find new opportunities".

"It is very essential for people today to understand about Belt & Road, because you are getting more business with China. I am involved in the legal industry and observe that many clients are coming from China Mainland to Hong Kong for business. It allows more of cross-border trading, oversea expansion, and that is essential".

"I think opportunities for Russia within Belt & Road are great. It's perfect. It's an interesting political situation around the world right now and a great way for Russia to explore Asian market more. Asian markets could also explore opportunities in former USSR countries and Eastern Europe. I feel like we have been interested in each other but left out. With Belt & Road we already been getting more Russian clients and I can use my knowledge of Russian, so I can be involved in more projects in Hong Kong and advance my career".

"Belt & Road is very important market area. If I look it from Finnish perspectives, it has great potential. The most important is a network. New people who might advise me to open new business. I can learn how ecosystem works and where to find new opportunities."

Results of The Belt and Road Survey

At the same time, the "Belt and Road Youth Survey" result announcement was conducted. A total of 884 responses from Macau, Singapore, Korea, Malaysia, Thailand, Indonesia, Mongolia and UAE were collected to see what young people (18 to 40 in accordance to the definition set by JCI Hong Kong) think about the "Belt and Road" initiative and how the initiative can benefit them. It was found 60% of the respondents know about the "Belt and Road" initiative, however only 25% of them can properly stated that there are 60 countries involved in "Belt and Road"

45.2% believed that being located at the "Belt and Road" regions will provide an leading positional advantages for an active involvement. As for Hong Kong's role in the "Belt and Road" initiative, over half of the responses from Hong Kong thinks they will provide a major supporting role for the "Belt and Road" countries to integrate their businesses in China.



MEDIA LUNCHEON 2018 – A WONDERFUL OPPORTUNITY FOR MEDIA NETWORKING

The Media Luncheon 2018 presented by National Corporate Communications Commission was successfully held on 27 March 2018. The event aimed to provide a golden opportunity for JC representatives from all Chapters to mingle and connect with local media.

National President Senator Ronald Kan, and the representatives of JCI Hong Kong took the chance to present the year plan and four key projects namely the Belt and Road International Youth Summit, Breathe of Hong Kong, Ten Outstanding Young Persons Selection and World Cleanup Day to local media.

Over 72 participants got together to present and exchange project ideas with more than 20 representatives from key local media.

8 media coverages of the event were found on different media. Few local chapters were also approached by the attended local media to follow up and arrange further interviews for their projects. We hope to see more and more media coverages and impact for our projects in future!

In the tiny West African nation of Benin, Voodoo remains a state religion. Yet, Voodoo remains the world’s most secretive and misunderstood religion, veiled in mystery. Predating many religions by tens of thousands of years, Voodoo is a way of life in its country of origin, Benin.

Team FA had also made a visit at the Chinese Embassy and had a meeting with the Chinese Economic & Commercial Counselor in Benin. Counselor Zhang shared a lot about what he has been researching and observing there in Benin.

The economy of Benin remains underdeveloped. Electricity supply is a major barrier of economic development, thus dependent on subsistence agriculture and cotton.

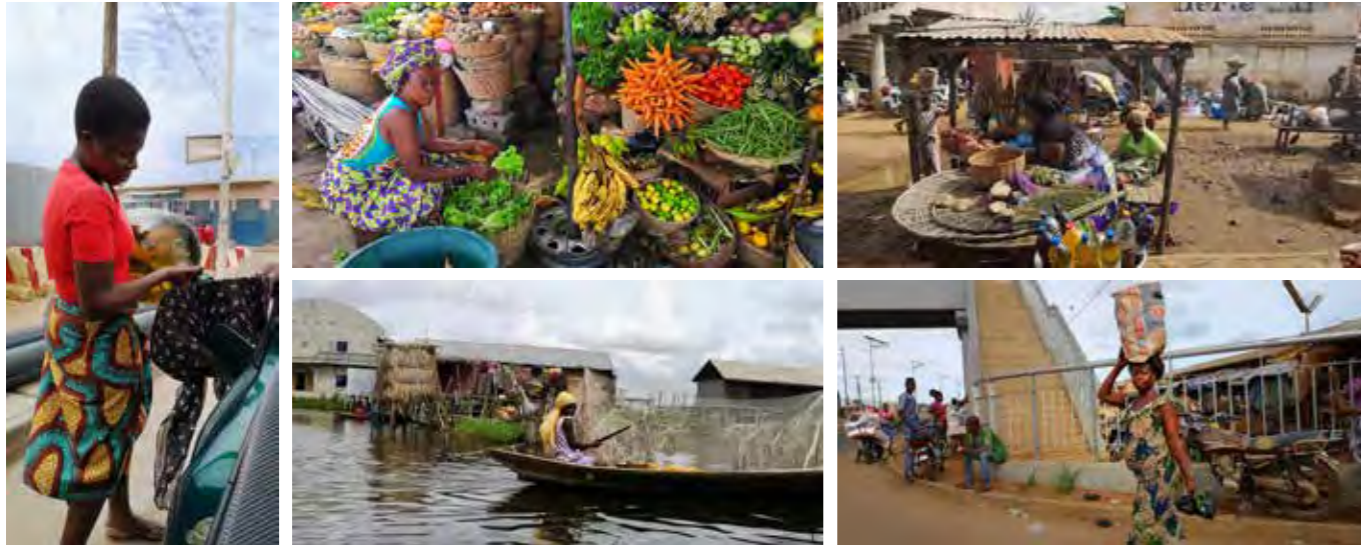
In Benin, small savings and loans groups drive rural women’s empowerment.

Women in rural areas play subordinate roles and do a great deal of hard labor.

The rules of a Savings and Loans Group are simple—anywhere from 10 to 35 women come together to form a group. They elect a President, a Secretary and a Treasurer, and every week put their savings into a common pool of funds, any of the members can ask for a loan and must repay it within the next three months, paying an interest rate of 5 - 10 per cent. The loan is used to invest in their businesses—for example, for buying seeds, cattle and tools to increase productivity. The loans do not require asset guarantee, which is particularly helpful for small-scale women farmers who often do not own land or assets.

True Story Behind Black Panther's Strong Women

The inspiration behind these warriors are the famous all-female African military corps of Dahomey, Benin, whom the French dubbed "Dahomey Amazons" after female warriors in Greek mythology. By the end of the 19th century an estimated 4,000 women, many of whom began their training as teens, were among the Dahomey military ranks. In times of war, during the transatlantic slave trade and in the fight against French colonialism, Dahomey female warriors were prepared to sacrifice their lives to protect the King.

Serving in the Dahomey Amazons offered women the opportunity to rise to positions of command and influence in an environment structured for individual empowerment. The Dahomey Amazons were also wealthy and held high status.

After the information session, members have attended a cooking class where they learned to prepare a Southeast Asian dish from a CLP chef, by using the latest induction cooktops offered by the CLP. It has been a fruitful morning for all, and also a reminder of the importance of sustainable living.



"SUPPORT BETTER WORLD" YOUTH DEVELOPMENT PLATFORM

Since 2017, JCI Hong Kong has started the "Support Better World" platform for local chapters and local non-profit organizations to showcase their efforts in supporting the Global Goals. NTDC was set up in 1992 with a purpose to develop training programs for JCI in Hong Kong and qualified trainers within the organization.

This year we came up with all-rounded strategies in order to elevate the JCIHK training culture. Referring to the situational leadership model, we would like to use four different leading styles to help JCIHK members to develop trainers' ASK (attitude, skills, knowledge):

S1) Telling (specific guidance and close supervision): Trainers Mentorship Program 2018 will provide the basic training skills development program and one-to-one guidance by mentors.

S2) Selling (explaining and persuading): The Power Learning Path (PLP) Program is aimed to create new role (Recommended trainer) and provide opportunity for members to develop their JCI knowledge and training skills.

S3) Participating (sharing and facilitating): Different training programs as 5-Star Camp & Leadership Academy provide opportunities for new trainers to participate in the training design process.

S4) Delegating (letting others do it): Trainers' database is created as a platform for providing the information about well-developed JCIHK trainers. It allows all chapters easy to find suitable trainers.
